Privacy Policy

Here's a quick list of all the access we have to your personal information:

Saved for Reddit requires the following access to your reddit account (oauth scopes):

History: Required to access your saved posts and comments

Identity: Required to access your reddit profile (username)

Read: Required to get **data about Reddit posts and comments**, such as title and upvote count

Save: Required to save and unsave posts from our app

Allow Decline

Upon logging in, **your reddit username and oauth credentials** (auth and refresh tokens) are stored on our servers.

To create a free account you are required to enter your name and email address. If you choose to create a Premium subscription account, thanks! Your payment information, including your credit card number, name, email address, country, and zipcode is safely stored on <u>Stripe</u>, and only a unique id is stored on our servers. This information (except your credit card number, which is kept secret) is available to me, the administrator, for administrative and customer service purposes, and grants the application access to your payment information stored on Stripe.

This site utilises cookies to store your session information, keeping you logged in. It's a unique ID so no personal data is needed.

The only personal data we store is the person's name and email address. And they can even fake their name if they want to. We store data about the Reddit posts, such as title and upvote count, but that is all public data.
